Yet as opportunities to educate ourselves have greatly increased, our time for reading has significantly diminished. And when we do read, we rarely have the patience to read in the slow, sustained fashion that great books require if we are to be truly transformed by them. theological texts, he reveals the rewards of a more spiritually transformative mode of reading—and how individuals and communities can achieve it.
