## Dislocated sternum fracture | Bone, Joint and Ligament ...

An anterior dislocation of this joint means that the collarbone has popped out in front of the sternum. A posterior dislocation means that the collarbone has gone behind the sternum. While both types of dislocations are very serious, a posterior dislocation can be a surgical emergency, as the end of

the collarbone becomes extremely close to the airway and large blood vessels of the heart and chest.

A sternal fracture is a fracture of the sternum (the breastbone), located in the center of the chest. The injury, which occurs in 5 – 8% of people who experience significant blunt chest trauma, may occur in vehicle accidents, when the still-moving chest strikes a steering wheel or dashboard or is injured by a seatbelt.

Although most of the sternal fractures are treated conservatively, sometimes a surgical fixation becomes necessary. The sternal anatomy and the stability of the anterior chest wall are restored by a stable fixation employing a locked plate osteosynthesis.

Dislocation. You will know immediately if your SC joint has dislocated. Dislocation causes severe pain that gets worse with any arm

movements. In anterior dislocation, the end of the clavicle juts out near the sternum. This causes a hard bump in the middle of the chest. In posterior dislocation, a bump is usually not obvious.
