The Dynamite Conspiracy is a narrative-driven retelling of the bombing of the anti-Union Los Angeles Times by Union Terrorists in 1910. The attack killed 20 people. After a six-month search by a bulldog detective, William Burns, the two conspirators were caught and put on trial in Los Angeles. The era's top defense attorney, Clarence Darrow, who was hired by Samuel Gompers of the American Federation of

Labor, defended them. Darrow eventually pleaded his clients guilty to save them from execution. He was himself put on trail, however, on a charge of jury bribery. these changes  
were due to a  
combination of  
social conditions,  
including the rise  
and decline of  
the police as an

institution; the  
parallel  
development of  
private  
detectives; the  
birth of the  
crusading  
newspaper  
reporter; and the  
beginnings of  
forensic science.  
Influential, too,  
was the new role  
model offered by  
a wildly popular  
British import  
named Sherlock  
Holmes.  
Focusing on the  
late 19th century  
and early 20th,  
this volume  
covers the  
formative years  
of American  
detective fiction.
