Daudet took a post as a schoolteacher at Ales, Gard, but found it intolerable, and moved to Paris to live with his brother, Ernest, who was working as a journalist. Daudet wrote poetry and several plays, and secured employment as a secretary to Morny, a Minister of Napoleon III. "Tartarin of Tarascon" is a tale of the adventures of Tartarin, a local hero of Tarascon, a small town in

---

southern France. Tatarin is a braggart and liar, inventing adventures and gaining a reputation as a swashbuckler. To live up to his reputation, he must travel to Algiers to face the lions. But Algiers is not the oriental land of fable, and there are no lions left to hunt. The book spawned two sequels: "Tartarin sur les Alpes" and "Port-Tarascon," as well as three film adaptations. Unpopular in the area of Tarascon when first issued, the Tatarin adventures made Tarascon famous, and there is now a museum in Tarascon devoted to Tatarin.

Following his enthusiastic reaction to seeing an African lion in a traveling menagerie, the over-imaginative town folks understand Tartarin to be planning a hunting expedition to Algeria. But here's the rub: Tartarin of Tarascon possesses the opposing qualities of Don Quixote and Sancho Panza; this disconcerting complexity of character is a terrible internal conflict for one seeking adventures. Like the Spanish gentleman, Tartarin has his head full of wild imagining from too much reading of African hunts, but being a fusion of Quixote and Sancho, his fancy for the hunt will clash with his love for domestic bliss. So he delays

---

departure. He would rather continue to read about the hardship of lion hunters than actually go out in the wild by himself, and hunt lions. After a while, to save face, Tartarin is forced to go hunting in North Africa. After gathering an absurd amount of equipment and weapons, he embarks on a boat from Marseille to Algiers, and hooks up with a con man posing as a Montenegrin prince who will take advantage of him in multiple ways.
