CROWNED BY THE FRENCH ACADEMY Alphonse Daudet was a French novelist and playwright. His father was a silk manufacturer who suffered reverses and lost his property. Daudet took a post as a schoolteacher at Ales, Gard, but found it intolerable, and moved to Paris to live with his brother, Ernest, who was working as a journalist. Daudet wrote poetry and several plays, and secured employment as a secretary to Morny, a Minister of Napoleon III. "Tartarin of Tarascon" is a tale of the adventures of Tartarin, a local hero of Tarascon, a small town in southern France. Tartarin is a braggart and liar, inventing adventures and gaining a reputation as a swashbuckler. To live up to his reputation, he must travel to Algiers to face the lions. But Algiers is not the oriental land of fable, and there are no lions left to hunt. The book spawned two sequels: "Tartarin sur les Alpes" and "Port-Tarascon," as well as three film adaptations. Unpopular in the area of Tarascon when first issued, the Tartarin adventures made Tarascon famous, and there is now a museum in Tarascon devoted to Tartarin.

Tartarin, a plump middle-aged man, is Tarascon's chief cap hunter. Following his enthusiastic reaction to seeing an African lion in a traveling menagerie, the over-imaginative town folks understand Tartarin to be planning a hunting expedition to Algeria. Alphonse Daudet (1840-1897), ne a Nîmes (Gard), est un écrivain et auteur dramatique français. Daudet se consacra à l'écriture, non seulement comme chroniqueur au journal Le Figaro mais aussi comme romancier. Puis, après avoir fait un voyage en Provence, Alphonse commença à écrire les premiers textes qui feront partie des Lettres de mon Moulin (1869). Il connut son premier succès en 1862-1865, avec la Dernière Idole, pièce montée à l'Odéon et écrite en collaboration avec Ernest Manuel - pseudonyme d'Ernest Lepine. Puis, il obtint, par le directeur du journal L'Evenement, l'autorisation de les publier comme feuilleton pendant tout l'été de l'année 1866, sous le titre de Chroniques Provençales. Le premier vrai roman d'Alphonse Daudet fut Le Petit Chose écrit

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en 1868. C'est en 1874 qu'Alphonse décida d'écrire des romans de mœurs comme: Fromont Jeune et Risler Aine mais aussi Jack (1876) et Le Nabab (1877). Pendant ces travaux de romancier et de dramaturge, il n'oublia pas pour autant son travail de conteur: il écrivit en 1872 Tartarin de Tarascon, qui fut son personnage mythique.
