Dear Justyce Everyman's Library Many of us have had the experience of being completely absorbed in a fascinating book, but periodically, and sometimes often, coming across words with which we are unfamiliar. It can be frustrating to stop in the middle of a sentence or paragraph and to look up a word in the dictionary. It takes away from the magic and flow of the story, not to mention the fact that it is a rather dry and boring task. Also, it is not the best way to improve one's vocabulary. It may be tempting to immediately check the meaning of a word that you don't know, but research and the experience of many students has shown that this is not a very effective method of learning new information. When we are simply given a definition for a word, we may be able to remember it in the short term, but if we encounter the word in a the future, we are unlikely to recall its meaning. However, if we have figured out the meaning of the word for ourselves, by paying close attention to the manner in which it was used in the sentence or paragraph, and if we practice using the word in different contexts, we are much

more likely to remember it in future. This is because when information becomes meaningful, that is, when we truly understand it and can apply it in different situations, then it can more easily be stored in our long-term memory so that we will have access to it whenever we might need it again. This is not the case if we simply memorize information. The aim of this book, therefore, is to encourage students practice using them in new to use their critical thinking skills by asking them to figure out the meaning of words by looking at how they are used in the context of a story.
