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As noted, chiaroscuro involves the combined use of light and shadow. 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There's very little warmth in the shadows. Caravaggio is almost synonymous with Tenebrism. His depiction of shadow and light is almost violent. Chiaroscuro, technique employed in the visual arts to represent light and shadow as they define three-dimensional objects. In European painting the technique was first brought to its full potential by Leonardo da Vinci in the late 15th century in such paintings as his Adoration of the Magi (1481).
