Actually, my purpose is to show that atheism is an intellectually respectable viewpoint despite recent efforts to prove otherwise. One point should be made concerning the structure of this handbook. In scholarly works there are numerous quotations and references which serve as important study aides. This technique seems inappropriate for a layman's handbook. The value of this work is found in its simplicity. For this reason the text is not interrupted by quotes or references.
