Sheila Kohler tackles innocence and abuse as a child wanders away from her mother, in thrall to a stranger she believes is the “ Magic Man. ” Kirstin Valdez Quade ’ s “ Nemecia ” depicts the after-effects of a secret, violent family trauma. Joan Wickersham ’ s “ The Tunnel ” is a tragic love story about a mother ’ s declining health and her daughter ’ s helplessness as she struggles to balance her responsibility to her mother and her own desires. New author Callan Wink ’ s “ Breatharians ” unsettles the reader as a farm boy shoulders a grim chore in the wake of his parents ’ estrangement. “ Elizabeth Strout was a wonderful reader, an author who knows well that the sound of one ’ s writing is just as important as and indivisible from the content, ” writes series editor Heidi Pitlor. “ Here are twenty compellingly told, powerfully felt stories about urgent matters with profound consequences. ”
