The work of a coterie of dynamic women - not the brainchild of Reform Judaism's male leaders, as is often thought - Women of Reform Judaism has been a force in the shaping of American Jewish life since its founding as the National Federation of Temple Sisterhoods in 1913. The synergy of Reform Judaism's universalist ideas and the women's emancipation movement in the early twentieth century made the synagogue auxiliary a natural platform for women to assume new leadership roles in their synagogues, in Reform Judaism, and in American society. These "sisterhoods" have stood for the solidarity among synagogue women as well as the commitment of these women to important social action issues. Called Women of Reform Judaism since 1993, this oldest federation of women's synagogue auxiliaries has grown from 52 temple sisterhoods to 500 and a membership of over 65,000 women, today a vibrant international women's organization. Women of Reform Judaism, in cooperation with The Jacob Rader Marcus Center of the American Jewish Archives and Hebrew Union College Press, marks its centennial anniversary with this collection of new scholarly essays which looks back at its history in order to understand how the hopes and dreams of its founders have come to fruition. Armed with the rich archival resources of the American Jewish Archives, including Proceedings of the National Federation of Temple Sisterhoods, 1913-1955, eighteen scholars contributed essays on the spectrum of Women of Reform Judaism's activities, including their funding of Hebrew Union College during the Great Depression, their support for Jewish education through production of a substantial women's Torah commentary designed to edify lay people as well as scholars and clergy, their promotion of Jewish foodways and art through publication of cookbooks and support of synagogue gift shops, their invention of the Uniongram as a formidable fundraising tool on a par with the Girl Scout cookie, and their efforts to safeguard Jewish continuity through support of youth activities (NFTY).

**The Country of the Blind and Other Stories** Presses univ. de Louvain

This preface tells the story of how Multimodal Usability responds to a special challenge. Chapter 1 describes the goals and structure of this book. The idea of describing how to make multimodal computer systems usable arose in the European Network of Excellence SIMILAR – “Taskforce for creating human-machine interfaces SIMILAR to human-human communication”, 2003–2007, www.similar.cc. SIMILAR brought together people from multimodal signal processing and usability with the aim of creating enabling technologies for new kinds of multimodal systems and demonstrating results in research prototypes. Most of our colleagues in the network were, in fact, busy extracting features and figuring out how to demonstrate progress in working interactive systems, while claiming not to have too much of a notion of usability in system development and evaluation. It was proposed that the authors support the usability of the many multimodal prototypes underway by researching and presenting a methodology for building usable multimodal systems. We accepted the challenge, first and foremost, no doubt, because the formidable team spirit in SIMILAR could make people accept outrageous things. Second, having worked for nearly two decades on making multimodal systems usable, we were curious – curious at the opportunity to try to understand what happens to traditional usability work, that is, work in human-computer interaction centred around traditional graphical user interfaces (GUIs), when systems become as multimodal and as advanced in other ways as those we build in research today.

Standing before the Berlin Wall with the Brandenburg Gate behind him, Ronald Reagan declared to the soviet leader, General Secretary Gorbachev, 'Mr. Gorbachev, tear down this wall.' On June 12, 2007 it will be exactly twenty years since Ronald Reagan made his now famous demand to the Soviet Union's leader. Two and one-half years later the Berlin Wall finally began to come down. With a few powerfully delivered words by one man and the moral fortitude of millions of people, the wall came down. Slowly, imperceptibly, judicial activism has created a wall designed to protect and promote sexual immorality. It is a wall that threatens to destroy the moral foundations of our society by enforcing the teaching of sexual immorality in all of our classrooms across this great land. The wall is built on nothing more or less than the gradual federalization of sexual morality itself. Federalism is the force and power supporting it. Ronald Reagan needed a great deal of courage to make his demand on that day. We also need the same courage today. We need the courage to admit to ourselves that it is time to, 'Tear down this wall.'
