At the Mountains of Madness, Lovecraft's incontrovertible masterpiece, written in February-March 1931, is a story details the events of a disastrous expedition to the barren, windswept Antarctic continent, where the secret history of our planet is preserved, amidst the ruins of its first civilization,

in September 1930, and what was found there by a group of explorers led by the narrator, Dr. William Dyer of Miskatonic University.
