Coleridge, first published in 1912, was edited by the poet's grandson, Ernest Hartley Coleridge. Volume II contains all the verse dramas (The Fall of Robespierre, The Piccolomini, The Death of Wallenstein, Remorse and Zapolya), epigrams and jeux d'esprit as well as various fragments, metrical experiments, first drafts, adaptations, bibliography and other appendices. Copious footnotes record textual variations and comments on the text. This new edition has been carefully hand-edited to be clear and complete.

Samuel Taylor Coleridge (1772-1834) was educated at Christ's Hospital, London and Jesus College, Cambridge. Close collaboration with Wordsworth resulted in joint production of the volume Lyrical Ballads in 1798, which contained Coleridge's 'The Rime of the Ancient Mariner', signposting the Romantic movement. After wintering in Germany in 1797-8 he settled in the Lake District, where he wrote the 'Letter' that turned into 'Dejection: An Ode' (1802). In later years Coleridge turned increasingly to prose, covering philosophical, political, religious and critical subjects, although new poems continued to appear in most years until his death.
