The main causes of the Crimean War were religion, in particular of the Holy sites in Jerusalem - this applied to all major powers, including France, Britain and the Ottoman Empire - and also British foreign policy which was strongly in support of the Ottoman Empire, as the British saw the Turkish lands as a barrier that could halt Russian expansionism.

The Crimean War took place between October 1853 and February 1856. The war was between Russia on one side and Britain, France, the Ottoman Empire (Turkey) and the Kingdom of Sardinia on the other.
