He is also the author of the novella *The Nutcracker* and the *Mouse King*, on which the famous ballet *The Nutcracker* is based. The ballet *Coppélia* is based on two other stories that Hoffmann wrote, while Schumann's *Kreisleriana* is based on Hoffmann's character Johannes Kreisler. Hoffmann's stories were very influential during the 19th century, and he is one of the major authors of the Romantic movement.
