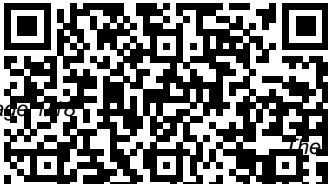

The Eloquent of Silence, first published in 1994, is considered a seminal text in the scholarship of women and North Africa. It also calls for a "decolonization" of concepts and theoretical systems used in accounting for women ' s lived reality, and a questioning of facile postfeminist discourses in their manifold expressions.
