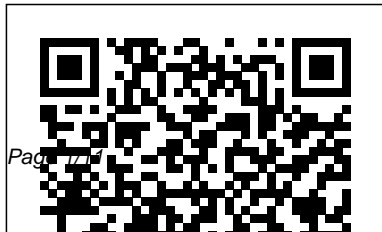


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# The Giver Study Guide Answer Key

As a last resort, Tambudzai takes an ecotourism job that forces her to return to her

parents' impoverished homestead. It is this homecoming, in Dangarembga's tense and psychologically charged novel, that culminates in an act of betrayal, revealing just how toxic the combination of colonialism and capitalism can be.
