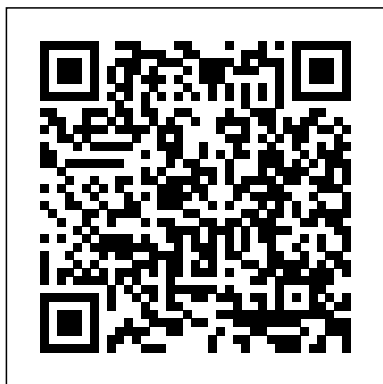

Her heroic actions eventually led to her arrest and imprisonment at Ravensbrück, the German Reich 's largest concentration camp for women.
