n the beginning, there was *The Three Musketeers*. Next, there was *Twenty Years After*. Finally, there was *The Vicomte de Bragelonne*. Together, the three books are known as Alexandre Dumas's *D'Artagnan Romances* and cover many years of adventures and swordfights, chronicling the lives of four Musketeers. The books were originally published in serial form, meaning they appeared one chapter at a time in the Parisian newspaper *Le Si é cle*. This explains why Dumas's chapters are fairly self-contained and tend to end with a cliff hanger. He needed to retain readers. You can think of the serial form as the 18th century equivalent of a weekly sitcom that keeps the attention of its audience from one week to the next. When *The Vicomte de Bragelonne* was put together for publication in book form, English translators took one look and realized it was too long. They typically break it up into smaller volumes - sometimes three, sometimes four. No matter how they slice it, they always entitle the last chunk *The Man in the Iron Mask*.
