Through their eyes and the eyes of their young son, José, readers follow the collapse of the old order and its bloody aftermath. *The City of Palaces* is a sweeping novel of interwoven lives: Miguel and Alicia; José, a boy as beautiful and lonely as a child in a fairy tale; the idealistic Francisco Madero, who overthrows Díaz but is nevertheless destroyed by the tyrant's political system; and Miguel's cousin Luis, shunned as a "sodomite."
