The sciences, in other words, have led to the implication that our universe has a creator and that the universe and the human genome have been designed.

Paul's gospel is misunderstood. Paul's gospel is seen as his message, perhaps an empowered message; he saw it differently. Not surprisingly, then, Paul rarely talks of preaching the gospel. He sees himself as "gosselling."
