playwright Gregorio Martínez Sierra. After his death, the authorship of his work was revealed to be that of María, making her one of the most important playwrights of her time. The plays are: *The Kingdom of God* (1928); *The Romantic Young Lady* (1920) and *Take Two From One* (1931). *María Martínez Sierra: A Great Playwright Hidden in Plain Sight* recognizes María de la O Lejárraga García, to use her birth name, as one of the most important female playwrights, not just in Spain, but globally, in the first half of the 20th century.
