Mood refers specifically to the effect a piece of writing has on the reader. Mood is how a piece of writing makes you feel. While tone and mood are distinct literary devices, they are often closely related. For example, it wouldn't be unusual for a poem with a somber tone to also have a somber mood—i.e., to make the reader feel somber as well.
