All the devices and methods that the researcher combines under the name of technique exist to satisfy these inescapable requirements. An understanding of this technique comprises the

Primary sources are the texts nearest to any subject of investigation; secondary sources are always written about primary sources. The most common primary sources are written documents. But primary sources can also include photographs, paintings, sculpture, architecture, oral interviews, statistical tables, and even geography. A thorough reading of secondary sources will equip the researcher with a sense of interpretation. Needless to say that one should not rely upon one secondary source, but to always incorporate
