Roberts's analysis begins with comedic female ghosts in literature and film and moves into horror by examining the successful play *The Woman in Black* and the legend of the weeping woman, *La Llorona*. Roberts then situates the canonical works of Maxine Hong Kingston and Toni Morrison in the tradition of the

female ghost to explore how the ghost is used to portray the struggle and pain of women of color. Roberts further analyzes heritage sites that use the female ghost as the friendly and inviting narrator for tourists. The book concludes with a comparison of the British and American versions of the television hit *Being Human*, where the female ghost expands her influence to become a mother and savior to all humanity.
