Modern medicines were prescribed for her mom after her last hospital stay and made a great difference. In the 1990s, Madelyn inherited all of the responsibilities of her mom. With her mom ' s mental condition

greatly improving, her mom ' s physical condition began to deteriorate rapidly. The number of doctors for her care grew to nine. Exhaustion and insomnia took over Madelyn ' s life, but she kept going due to her love for her mother and the kindness of her mom under terrible circumstances.
