Tracheostomy Care Management

Begin assessing his tracheostomy by inspecting the stoma site, which is typically slightly larger than the tracheostomy tube. Note the amount, color, consistency, and odor of tracheal and stomal secretions. Confirm the tracheostomy tube size and whether it's cuffed or fenestrated.

A tracheostoma is an artificial opening made in the trachea just below the larynx. A tracheostomy tube is a tube that is inserted through the opening, or stoma, to create an artificial airway. Patients who need long-term airway support (long-term patients who are intubated) or who have a need to bypass the upper airway may receive a tracheostomy. always check for the client's comfort level or reaction/s. Make sure to document the date and time of the performance of the procedure, the assessment made prior to tracheostomy care and if the cuff is maintained deflated or inflated depending on physician's order.

Tracheostomy Replacement (Adult, Neonatal, Peds)

Proof of delivery documentation must be made available to the Medicare contractor upon request. All services that do not have appropriate proof of delivery from the supplier shall be denied as not reasonable and necessary. A tracheostomy care or cleaning starter kit (A4625) is covered following an open surgical tracheostomy.
