How the female body has been racialized for over two hundred years
There is an obesity epidemic in this country and poor black women are particularly stigmatized as "diseased" and a burden on the public health care system. This is only the most recent incarnation of the fear of fat black women, which Sabrina Strings shows took root more than two hundred years ago. Strings weaves together an eye-opening historical narrative ranging from the Renaissance to the current moment, analyzing important works of art, newspaper and magazine

articles, and scientific literature and medical journals—where fat bodies were once praised—showing that fat phobia, as it relates to black women, did not originate with medical findings, but with the Enlightenment era belief that fatness was evidence of "savagery" and racial inferiority. The author argues that the contemporary ideal of slenderness is, at its very core, racialized and racist. Indeed, it was not until the early twentieth century, when racialized attitudes against fatness were already entrenched in the culture, that the medical establishment began its crusade against obesity. An important and original work, *Fearing the Black Body* argues convincingly that fat phobia isn't about health at all, but rather a means of using the body to validate race, class, and gender prejudice.

Within the following five decades it was to become a 639 licensed-bed, full-care pediatric center accredited with commendation by the Joint Commission on Accreditation of Healthcare Organizations. Legacy tells the vivid and moving stories behind this remarkable evolution into one of the largest, full-care pediatric hospitals in the United States. Gleaned from hundreds of personal interviews and oral histories, countless publications,

and archival documents, this detailed narrative history reflects a multifaceted perspective. That realization is illustrated in a series of historical profiles of selected areas and services, each enveloped by the personal recollection of an experience within that particular area or service. Betsy Parish, a former newspaper columnist, is a fifth generation descendent of one of the pioneering families who settled Houston in 1838 and the granddaughter of a 1911 alumnus of Baylor University College of Medicine. She is an avid supporter of efforts to document and preserve the history of healthcare in Houston. This is her first book. This practice-based philosophical study presents the view that professional healthcare is not just one of the many paid professions.
