In 1931 Universal Pictures released *Dracula* and *Frankenstein*, two films that inaugurated the horror genre in Hollywood cinema. These films appeared directly on the heels of Hollywood's transition to sound film. *Uncanny Bodies* argues that the coming of sound inspired more in these massively influential horror movies than screams, creaking doors, and howling wolves.
