In July of 1856, a brazen American adventurer, William Walker, grabbed control in Nicaragua and proclaimed himself president, then legalized slavery, but a

coalition of Latin American states overthrew him. This threw some fuel on the "Slavocracy" theory (a conspiracy theory where the South was always seeking new slave land).
