Using Visual Studio to add a.gitignore file Inside of Visual Studio open the Team Explorer window. If you don't already have it open use the quick launch in the upper right hand side of the window to search for it. If it is not already on the Home page click the house icon in the top of the Team Explorer window.

Add an Existing Project to a Solution - SQL Server ...

Visual Studio and support tools provide a huge variety of ways to create new items in projects, but most are rather key intensive. Visual Studio really is in need of a very quick and keyboard (or single mouseclick of the context menu) centric approach to getting new files into a project.

Create a Project from Existing Code Files To start with, from the Main Menu of Visual Studio, Navigate to File > New > Project from Existing Code This will bring the " Create New Project from Existing Code Files " Wizard. In this screen, you only need to select the project language Visual Basic or Visual C# and click on Next.

Yes with Visual Studio we can directly add the folder or files without adding it manually one by one in simple steps. First copy the files to the project folder in the explorer, just copy the files alone or if required the folder as well to the project solution folder (just do a simple ctrl+c and ctrl+v) as shown below.

To add an existing project to a solution In Solution Explorer, select the solution. On the File menu, point to Add, and click Existing Project. In the Add Existing Project dialog box, locate the project you want to add, select the project file, and then click Open.

If you have a Form in your Project and you want to add it to another Project in some other Solution, you can: Right Click on Project in Solution Explorer Select Add -> Existing Item In the Add Existing Item Dialog Box browse and select the target "Form.cs" and select Add to add it to

your project.

The trick to add a file as a link is not in the menu options in Visual Studio itself, that's also where I started searching. You have to first add an existing item to your desired folder, as shown below. After selecting the file, don't click Add, but click the dropdown next to the Add button. There you can select Add As Link.

When creating a new solution (or retro fitting an existing solution to use new libraries), I end up using File | Add | Existing project a lot. As I was curious about how extensions in Visual Studio worked, I decided to write a very simple one to ease the grunt work of adding multiple common projects. This simple extension is the result.
