It also includes a number of recommendations for methods to promote such standards including training, performance improvement, trauma team organisation and hospital inspection.

There are no universally accepted standards for developing systematic reviews leading to variability in how conflicts of interest and biases are handled, how evidence is appraised, and the overall scientific rigor of the process. In Finding What Works in Health Care the Institute of Medicine (IOM) recommends 21 standards for developing high-quality systematic reviews of comparative effectiveness research. The standards address the entire systematic review process from the initial steps of formulating the topic and building the review team to producing a detailed final report that synthesizes what the evidence shows and where knowledge gaps remain. Finding What Works in Health Care also proposes a framework for improving the quality of the science underpinning systematic reviews. This book will serve as a vital resource for both sponsors and producers of systematic reviews of comparative effectiveness research.

Some redundant sections are removed based on the feedback we received. More management sections (such as managing acute alcohol intoxication, sepsis, renal failure, etc) are added. New section on "Introduction to Cardiology Procedures" is added. All the sections are edited and at least one-third of the book has changed. The sole purpose of this booklet is to help new interns in the beginning of the year. It is mostly focused on inpatient medicine and ICU rotations - how to handle the most common floor calls, such as chest pain, uncontrolled HTN, vomiting and to help guide running RRT/ Code Blue. With advances in technology such as widespread use of electronic medical records, this booklet has been electronically formatted to meet the demands of dynamic medical system. We hope this booklet will make your intern year less stressful, so that you can focus on learning, the decision making process, and ultimately, better patient care.
