There are also waterfalls and the season of fall when we have fall colors and fall weather. And at night

darkness falls over the land. Regardless of the many meanings of the word fall, 'We All Fall Down' focuses on people actually falling from a walking, standing, or seated position due to the force of gravity. The book gives advice on how to prevent falls by showing many examples from the author's experience as an expert witness at lawsuits, but also as a practicing architect and academic with +40 years of experience.
