The story of Mary Poppins, the quintessentially English and utterly magical children's nanny, is remarkable enough. She

flew into the lives of the unsuspecting Banks family in a children's book that was instantly hailed as a classic, then became a household name when Julie Andrews stepped into the starring role in Walt Disney's hugely successful and equally classic film. Now she is a sensation all over again-both on Broadway and in Disney's upcoming film Saving Mr. Banks. Saving Mr. Banks retells many of the stories in Valerie Lawson's biography Mary Poppins, She Wrote, including P. L.
