Chaucer died about 1400: date uncertain. He was a protégé of Richard II, in whose reign Chaucer's anti-Church writings were accepted. When Richard was deposed and murdered, Archbishop Thomas Arundel—"the Henry Kissinger of his day"—was given free rein.

Chaucer died of unknown causes on 25 October 1400, although the only evidence for this date comes from the engraving on his tomb which was erected more than 100 years after his death. There is some speculation [29] that he was murdered by enemies of Richard II or even on the orders of his successor Henry IV, but the case is entirely circumstantial.
