Looking back at her lengthy career just four years before her death, modernist painter Nell Blaine said, "Art is central to my life. Not being able to make or see art would be a major deprivation." The presentation—and its companion exhibition—features artists from all of the Southern states, including Dusti Bong é, Anne Goldthwaite, Anna Hyatt Huntington, Ida Kohlmeyer, Lo ï s Mailou Jones, Alma Thomas, and Helen Turner. These essays examine how the variables of historical gender norms, educational barriers, race, regionalism, sisterhood, suffrage, and modernism mitigated and motivated

these women who were seeking expression on canvas or in clay.
