Windows 7 All Users Documents

There may be times where you want to change the default location of a user's My Documents folder. For example, I keep all my data on a D: partition. This way should I need to reinstall the operating system on the C: partition, no data is lost: 1. Click on the Start button: 2. Right click on Documents: 3. Select Properties: 4. This will bring up a similar window. USERNAME will be replaced by the actual user's login name: 5. Click on Include a folder... 6.

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Adding files to all users 'My Documents' folders in Windows

All Users Desktop Folder: C:\Users\Public\Desktop\ All Users Start Menu Folder: C:\ProgramData\Microsoft\Windows\Start Menu\ In Explorer, you need to check "Show Hidden Files" at Tools > Folder Options > View in order to view these folders. Alternatively, you can just type the full path in Explorer or the Run box.

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How to open the Windows My Documents or Documents folder

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Quick way to reset all security permissions to default ...

To access the Folder Options you must press "ALT" in Windows Explorer to make the menu visible. You'll find them under tools. Now, you should be able to see Documents and Settings. But if you double click on it, you'll get an error messages.

Changing Windows7 My Documents Location - One Computer Guy

1. Click start, then click All programs, or click programs. 2. Click Accessories, then Command prompt(Windows XP). Or click with your right mouse button on Command prompt, then click Run as administrator(Windows Vista). 3. In the Command prompt window type net users and hit Enter. A list of user accounts will show. 4.

Windows 7 - Path to All Users Desktop and All Users Start ...

Opening Documents in Windows 7 Showing Documents through Windows Explorer. Open Windows Explorer. Double-click the Libraries folder; Double-click the Documents folder. Double-click the My Documents folder. Viewing Documents through the Start menu. Click Start in the lower-left corner of the screen. Click Documents on the right side of the Start menu that pops up.

You have a few options: Put the document in some common place (like %allusersprofile%\Documents, or %program files%\yourCompany\yourApp\documents) and create a start menu link/icon that points to either the folder with the documents or the document itself. Put the document into the Default User documents folder.
