The *Woman Rebel* was published by Margaret Sanger in New York, NY in 1914, and, alongside *Mother Earth*, was one of the

leading anarchist voices in the fight for birth control and women's rights. However Sanger also possessed appalling eugenicist ideas, which were deeply discriminatory against disabled people. While eugenics are considered fringe these days, they had surprising support at the time amongst intellectuals including Sanger and figures like W.E.B. Du Bois, who worked with Sanger in ...

### **MSPP / Documents Online / Margaret Sanger and the Woman Rebel**

In the early twentieth century, birth control advocate Margaret Sanger published eight issues of a feminist magazine called The Woman Rebel. During this time, discussion of sex education, birth control, and abortion were illegal. The magazine featured literary pieces on topics like women's rights, love and marriage, women in the workplace, reproductive and sexual education, and contraception.

In 1914, the birth control advocate Margaret Sanger founded a magazine called The Woman Rebel as a forum to fight for legal contraception. It was the first major activist effort she would make on her own, and the reaction was fast and fierce.

In 1914, Sanger launched her own feminist publication, *The Woman Rebel*, advocating for birth control. She was charged with violating the Comstock laws and fled to England, though had friends share a pamphlet she authored on contraceptive techniques in her absence.

It was in March 1914 that Margaret Sanger published the first issue of her radical, anarchist monthly, *The Woman Rebel*. Edited and published by Sanger, who sought to educate and raise the consciousness of working women through a newspaper devoted to their specific needs. Emblazoned with the slogan, "No Gods, No Masters," it was designed as a call to arms for working-class women.
