No fewer than 223 verses in Proverbs appear two times (79 sets), three times (15 sets), or even four times (5 sets) in identical or slightly altered form—more than 24% of the book. Heim analyzes all of these, presenting them in delineated Hebrew lines and in English translation. Where appropriate, the translations are followed by textual notes that discuss uncertainties regarding the textual witnesses (textual criticism) and explore lexical, grammatical, and syntactical problems. Heim also analyzes the way the parallelism in each verse of a variant set has been constructed, presenting diagrams and tables with columns that highlight the corresponding similarities and differences among repeated verses. Key to this investigation is the search for links between the variants and their surrounding verses, such as repetitions of sound and sense. Heim shows that most variant repetitions result from skillful poetic creativity. He develops criteria for determining the direction of borrowing between the verses and demonstrates that the phenomenon of variant repetition is an editorial concern that operates on the level of the book as a whole. This study sheds new light on the nature of biblical poetry and on the methods and virtues best suited for its study. Romans Bible Commentary: This Bible commentary on the book of Romans offers a verse-by-verse study on the entire book. Here is a small sample of the text. 5:9: Much more then, being now justified by his blood, shall we be saved from the wrath (of God) through him. This verse takes us back to what Paul said at the beginning of this chapter: God ’ s people can be “ justified ” (dikaio), the same word used in Rom. 3:20! It is possible to completely remove sin. This can be done even though we still sin after becoming a Christian. Also, we can have justification at the present time (“ now ”). In this verse, Paul affirmed that our source for justification is Christ ’ s “ blood. ” Without the blood of Jesus, justification would be impossible (Heb. 10:4). Christ ’ s blood is the basis for our justification, but the benefits of it must be accessed. This access comes by faith that is obedient (5:1). If Christ had not shed his blood, the only thing that we could and would experience is “ wrath ” (verse 9b). However, since the precious blood of the Lord was shed, Christians can be and will be saved from punishment. Christians are people who are at peace with God (verse 1) and have no fear of condemnation (8:1).

Here is a small sample of the text: Introduction to First Corinthians 13: Some consider 1 Cor. 13 the “ love chapter of the Bible ” or a “ parenthetical description of love, ” but this chapter is actually an integral part of Paul ’ s discussion about spiritual gifts. Since the Corinthians were rude, jealous, and boastful, it was necessary for them “ to go beyond their present pursuit. To the apostle, the development of the character of the person was superior to the exercise of the gift. His contrasts (chap. 13) are clear: gifts without love vs. gifts with love, and the permanence of love vs. the temporal nature of gifts ” (Gromacki, p. 159). Stated another way, verses 1-3 affirm that spiritual gifts were worthless without love, verses 4-7 affirm that love was superior to the gifts, and verses 8-13 assert that spiritual gifts were temporal but love abides. Although 1 Cor. 13 may seem familiar to many, this chapter is often one of the most misunderstood parts of the New Testament. The Corinthians ’ elevation of spiritual gifts over love is seen in places such as 12:13-25; 14:27-33, 40. It is also found by contrasting the qualities in 1 Cor. 13 with other sections of this epistle. For instance, love “ suffers long ” (13:4), but tongue speakers at Corinth were impatient (14:27-28). Love does not “ envy ” (13:4), but the Corinthians envied the gifts of others (chapter 12). Love “ is not puffed up ” (13:4), but tongue speakers were proud (compare 13:1). Love causes people to act in a kind and orderly way, but some of the Corinthians ’ behavior was disorderly (14:23, 40). Love is not “ unseemly, ” but the Corinthians were at risk of unseemly behavior in their families (1 Cor. 7:36) as well as their Sunday assemblies (1 Cor. 11:2-16, 17-34). Agape love “ does not seek its own ” (13:5), but these Christians were seeking their own (see 1 Cor. 8 and the discussion about idol meat). Love keeps people from “ rejoicing in evil ” (13:6), but the Corinthians rejoiced in evil (1 Cor. 5:2, 6). There were various things that “ provoked ” these brethren (13:5) and it seems they were “ keeping a record of evil ” (1 Cor. 13:5). It was time for the members of this congregation to show some spiritual maturity and demonstrate the type of love that “ bears all things, believes all things, hopes in all things, and endures all things ” (1 Cor. 13:7).
