The publication is based on the "Adult Readiness Roundtable" Project co-sponsored by CAAL and the National Center on Education and the Economy on April 6-7, 2009. It is not a transcript of the Roundtable discussion; instead it reports on a two-day discussion meeting among a group of exemplary adult-education-for-work programs from around the country. It aims to stimulate thinking and action at the state and local levels, especially among provider groups that recognize the need for new approaches to service provision. The achievements reported by participants in the CAAL-NCEE Roundtable make a compelling case that adult education for work can and should expand to reach its full potential, and that its growth should be a large part of the growth of adult education and related programs in coming years. This will require leadership at all levels, and it will require changes in public policy to break down the silos that have constrained this and other important advances in workforce development. The barriers to growth of adult education for work identified by the Roundtable suggest, however, that local and state action will not be enough. Participants expressed support for the National Commission's proposals to create a federal policy structure targeted at supporting adult education for work as a priority service for meeting our national workforce needs, and for a substantial infusion of new federal funding to allow that service to realize its full potential to help rebuild the American economy over the next decade. The book is a combined effort of scholars who participated in a conference entitled "Post-Soviet Youth: A Comparative Study." The book focuses on the post-perestroika period, a time of great instability and change on the national and individual level. It analyzes the effect of this dynamic on youth, who in the transitional phase of adolescence are particularly susceptible to social disruption. The scope includes not only youth who remained in the former Soviet Union but also those who emigrated to the West- Israel, Germany, the U.S. and Greece. It was considered important to place this study in a cross-cultural framework in order to differentiate between local influences and the common denominators from the Soviet background. From Pacesetters to Dropouts offers an important contribution to the study of the effect of a particular form of socialization on youth in a period of stress and change. It is relevant not only to understanding the changes undergone by an important segment of society in the former Soviet Union but also to studying the experience of other immigrant groupings in an era characterized by widespread migration.

HM Revenue & Customs' PaceSetter Programme, aimed at streamlining business operations, has improved productivity through new ways of working and may have contributed to greater staff engagement. However, the National Audit Office has concluded that the Programme is not yet value for money because the extent to which efficiency has improved is not clear; and some key principles of process improvement are not yet being applied strategically across the entire organisation and embedded into the Department's core processes. PaceSetter, introduced five years ago, is designed to help HMRC change the way it works, to deliver more for less resource. The Department has pioneered the use of process improvement techniques in central government. Improvements include the redesign of claim forms and the standardisation of procedures across offices. The Department estimated that PaceSetter produced productivity improvements, with over £400 million of resource savings and £860 million of tax yield. It is not clear, however, if reported savings represent overall efficiency improvements, in part because of the limited evidence on overall trends in business performance. The PaceSetter Programme has had a small positive impact on staff engagement but overall it is still low. HMRC does not have a full understanding of the costs of PaceSetter. The Department decided to monitor only certain of the costs excluding the salary costs of its own PaceSetter experts. NAO analysis shows a more complete assessment of costs brings the total spent on PaceSetter from £55 million to at least £115 million between 2005-06 and 2010-11. To maximise the benefits of PaceSetter, the Department needs to use the Programme to help it streamline its business operations in a more strategic way.

Benson Idahosa, as a young man heard his pastor preach that all things are possible to those that believe. After service, he moved all over Benin, from house to house asking whether there was a dead person he could pray for to resurrect. The Osborns, known for their open air meetings in Africa. You will realise that many of the outstanding African pastors have their roots in the ministry of the Osborns. When T.L Osborn died, he left his daughter, Dr. LaDonna Osborn in charge. She still does what her parents were doing. More than 150,000 churches have been established through their ministry. Enoch Adeboye, In 1975 he was ordained a pastor and after the death of Pastor Josiah, he started on his duty as the General Overseer to grow the church. It is estimated that the church has over 15 million members in Nigeria and over 28 million members worldwide. Reinhard Bonnke, as teenager, after he accepted Christ, he attended a Sunday service where during their preaching, he sensed God speaking to him that he would one day preach the gospel in Africa. In 1967 he arrived in South Africa with his wife, Anni. He has witnessed over 66 million souls coming to Christ in Africa around the world. Angus Buchan, the farmer evangelist who in the early years of ministry wanted to organise and evangelistic campaign but was turned down by the local pastors whom he first contacted. Teresa Wairimu, the evangelist who longed to be prayed for to receive an impartation from Reinhard Bonnke and followed him upto Norway. She received the impartation later on. She is known for the big crusades in Uhuru Park and also for her gift of prophesy. Rev. Teresa has set a standard that women can also be used greatly by God in mass evangelism. David Oyedepo, before starting the church, he read 39 biographies of outstanding ministries, discovering how great ministries are run, acquiring sound knowledge and thinking for running a great ministry.
