For older grades, the teacher may opt to assign it as homework. *Questions: Items to be discussed in class. For older grades, the teacher can assign these questions as homework but should also use them as a basis for class discussion. These are not the only questions that could or should be asked. Teachers should encourage students to come with their own questions as well. This edition was written by Harvey De Groot and edited by his son Norlan De Groot.
