Answer: An effective
sentence is one that
conveys the point you want
to make clearly and
persuasively to your
reader. A sentence is clear
if it does not have grammar
and spelling errors.

Additionally, clarity means the sentence uses the most precise words possible and doesn't have unnecessary wordiness.

First, they establish the main point that the rest of the paragraph supports.
