This important new book is particularly appropriate to classroom teachers, system developers and student teachers studying curriculum.

The educational system of Australia is described, and placement recommendations concerning Australian students who want to study in the United States

are presented. After describing preschool and primary education, secondary education in the following provinces/territories is considered: New South Wales, Victoria, Queensland, South Australia, Western Australia, Tasmania, the Australian Capital Territory, and the Northern Territory. The universities and the colleges of advanced education (CAE) are compared, and information is provided on admission, degrees and diplomas, courses, grades, educational quality, and documents and certificates. Degrees, grading, quality, and documents in technical and further education are also considered, along with teaching qualifications and teaching documents and certificates. Preparation and qualifications for the following professional programs are addressed: nursing education, music and speech/drama education, theological education, and professional associations. Appendices include: a profile of Australian postsecondary institutions, New South Wales secondary mathematics and sciences syllabi; and comparative data on university versus CAE Bachelor of Engineering Courses. It's insightful, hilarious, serendipitous, treacherous, cunning and at times graphic, whilst providing a wonderful snapshot into the evolution of Australian culture in the 1980s. This book is a cross between Pulp Fiction and Breaking Bad and not the stereotypical view of Australia. *Examination and Certificates* Pascal Press Nature and Love by David Sidney Harris Nature and Love, David Sidney Harris' first published book, was written between 1998 and 2000. Nature and Love is both poetic and autobiographical, and was seen as a powerful tool of self-expression, catharsis, and a way for Harris to uniquely comment upon and unravel his individual perception of the world. The poems within speak of love, nature, family, and (psychiatric) healing. His healing poems, "The Pink Room" and "The Legacy of Persecution," describe Harris' experience as an inpatient in psychiatric hospital wards. Half of the biography reveals Harris' suffering from a near-fatal car accident (November 4, 1977) which has changed his life. Harris tells his story of tragedy, his zest for life, and deep feelings. Many readers may find inspiration from Nature and Love, while others may relate to its sentiments.

These reforms encompass many aspects of a system that supports teaching quality, and highlight: the way teachers are trained, how they are inducted into the teaching profession and supported with mentors, the professional learning they receive, how they are appraised on their work, and the career pathways for teachers.
